A message from our new Chaplain, Jude Caspersz



Hello Parents and Guardians,
I am delighted to join the St Mary's community as School Chaplain. This role will be working primarily with individual children and families that have gone through the referral process, commencing with the class teacher or leadership team. I see the role primarily as pastoral care, with a spiritual lens.

As a brief background, I am the youngest of 8 siblings. We migrated here from Ceylon (Sri Lanka) when I was 5 years of age. I grew up in the North-eastern suburbs where I met my wife, Domenica who is a nurse and of Italian descent. We have three children in their 20s. I am a passionate Beatles fan - after all, they named a song after me! I faithfully follow the current woes of Collingwood and enjoy gardening and watercolour painting.

I have worked in Catholic education for over 30 years, teaching in the Northern Territory, and several Melbourne primary schools. Besides some wonderful years as Class Teacher, I held leadership positions of Principal, Deputy, RE, Welfare/Wellbeing. I left the school setting to work in the R.E. team at the Catholic Education Office (now Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools) and lectured in R.E. at ACU. At present I am the Student Support Coordinator at Catholic Theological College, University of Divinity, which I will be continuing in a part-time capacity. Here I coordinate support services for our tertiary students and lecturers in a range of areas, as well as some adjunct lecturing in R.E. and Academic Writing. Many of the students I work with are seminarians, training to become priests here in Melbourne, interstate or overseas. I look forward to balancing these two roles that have similarities and some important differences. I am excited to be back in the real world of a dynamic primary school community, such as St Mary's. I am very impressed with what I have already seen.




A notice will be sent out in Term 3 asking for bookings. Final organisation details will be sent out as per whatever COVID restrictions are in place at the time.

We understand that not all parents will be able to attend during the day. Therefore, the Maths Leader presentation will be recorded and uploaded to the School website.


Games and resources will be given out at the end of the session.



WELLBEING

A snapshot of Social and Emotional Learning from around the school in Term Two.

Positive Coping and Problem Solving.

The students in Prep have been learning about positive self-talk and what we can say to ourselves when we need to get through a hard time or a challenging situation. They also practiced a calming strategy called 'belly breathing'. Belly breathing is a great technique to use when we need to relax or calm ourselves down.



Calm Corners

Many of our classrooms have a calm corner. A calm corner is a designated space in a classroom with the sole intent of being a safe space for a student to go to when they feel their emotions are running too high and they need space to regulate their emotions.

This poster in a Year One room is an example of how visual images of coping strategies help students to identify what they can do to help themselves regulate their emotions.



Circle Time - Problem Solving



Many classrooms have been participating in circle time. Circle time helps to develop positive relationships between children. It aims to give them tools to engage with and listen to each other. It's often used as an opportunity to solve problems that are affecting the class, for example too much talking during lessons, or friendship issues on the playground.




The whole class takes part in circle time at the same time, usually led by their teacher, who sits in the circle with their pupils. The circle encourages unity, respect, turn-taking and working together towards a shared vision.

In Year Four the students have also been adding to a gratitude tree. Through identifying and naming problems, the students have been able to discuss how being grateful and looking for the positives help us cope when we find ourselves in challenging or upsetting situations.

Gender Equity

Year 5 and 6 sessions with facilitator Kate Wilde



The students in year five and year six have been participating in group sessions with Kate Wilde. They have been participating in lots of fun learning around gender equity. They are preparing to share their learning by running some information sessions and activities with the year three and four students next term.

Social and Emotional Goal Setting.

The Year Three students set themselves goals identifying what they would like to achieve in relation to their relationships with their peers.

E.g. 'My goal outside is to play nicely and include others in my games.'
'My goal is to get to know more about other people.'



Wow.....we can't believe we have reached the end of another term. This term has been so much fun, with the highlights including our focus on National Heart Week, Better Buddies – Caring for Others, Animal Habitats and National Reconciliation Week. We are super excited for another fun filled term, with some fantastic winter activities and a cultural focus on Japan to get us started. We hope that everyone has a safe and relaxing holiday.

What happened in OHS last week

Over the last week the children enjoyed a week focused on Art. Children completed self portraits, did sculpture with rainbow dough, watercolour painting, and art deco pictures, engaged in movement and dance with various props, used construction activities to build abstract objects, and did some chalk art outside. 
