Staffing 2022

I have been conducting interviews throughout this month as there will be some staff changes in 2022. Once I have completed staffing, I will inform everyone of the changes and the various year levels and leadership positions that teachers will be working in.

Visitors to St Mary's

The use of Service Victoria QR codes for electronic record keeping is now mandatory in all schools to enable the effective contact tracing of any COVID-19 cases. At this stage, unfortunately, parents are not permitted to enter the school premises. Essential visitors to our school admin building must comply with density limits, face mask requirements, QR code check-ins and practise respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene. Once volunteers are permitted to resume, they will be required to sign in and provide their vaccination status.

Mask Wearing

As per the latest organisational guide, for all school settings, the Victorian Chief Health Officer directs students in Year 3 to Year 6 to wear face masks when indoors on school premises, unless an exception applies. The CHO also strongly recommends students in Prep to Grade 2 to wear a face mask indoors at school or OSHC program. Although mask wearing regulations may change in the public domain, schools will continue to expect students, parents and staff to wear their masks until otherwise informed.

Transition

On Wednesday 3rd November St Mary's is thrilled to be hosting its first transition session for our 2022 Preps. We have organised nine groups and will be communicating the time slot for each child. Unfortunately, parents are unable to attend therefore we have shortened the time to half an hour to enable the children to familiarise themselves with the classrooms and time to meet the Prep teaching group. Hopefully the 2nd session on November 9th will allow some greater opportunities. Please meet physically distanced outside our admin area. The teachers will come and greet you and the children and take them into the classroom.

School Hats

Just a reminder, school hats are to be worn during all outside activities, by all students and staff.

Safety in the Carpark

It has come to my attention that unsafe practices are occurring at pick up and drop off times. It is imperative that when using the drop off zones, students' school bags must not be in the boot because the student should promptly be exiting the car on the footpath side and parents/carers remain in the car. It is dangerous walking in between cars. Secondly, the carpark is not a playground! Please ensure all students are standing with you, not rolling on the grass or playing chasey amongst the cars. Thank you for your support in this matter as child safety is paramount.

Student Attendance

On Wednesday the 3rd November all students will return to onsite learning except those quarantining and our hearts go out to them and their families. If for whatever reason you have chosen to keep your child at home you will need to speak with me. Your child will be marked as absent as remote learning finishes on Friday 29th October. Naturally if your child is unwell please keep them at home and go through the regular policy of informing the school before 10am. We are so excited to have everyone return.

Covid Positive Update

On a positive note, thus far all close contacts have tested negative. Our prayers and thoughts are with our student and their family, and our parent and their family, who have tested positive. We look forward to welcoming you back soon.

Dear Parents,

I am writing to advise you of the School Fees and Levies for 2022. This year, the School Business Manager and School Advisory Council of St Mary's reviewed the level of School Fees and Levies and agreed with MACS recommendation of the level of fees and levies for the following year.

There are three main fees payable by parents; School Fees, Curriculum Levies, and Capital Building Fund.

School Fees:

The School Fees for 2022 will increase by \$10. The reason for this minimal increase is noted below.

- From a practical perspective this will assist the ongoing increased costs of running the school; electricity, water, gas, updated air conditioning, rates, increased expenditure in ICT, wages and maintenance of our buildings.

The Per Student Levy:

The Levies provide the funding to allow St Mary's to implement and support programs to ensure we are continuing to educate the whole child in a personalised and stimulating manner.

The per student levy for 2022 will increase by \$45 which assists payment for;

- all curriculum charges, excursions/incursions or other curriculum activities such as swimming and sports
- activities and stationery items. All stationery items will be purchased and distributed to your child in class as required through a bulk order.
- literacy experts, MSL, teaching of Functional Italian Language for Years Prep to Year Six, curriculum resources, consumables, photocopying, the ability to provide specialist programs and resources, including a Science and Technologies Teacher who is utilising a STEM approach (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), e-Smart Digital Licences for each student, audio visuals, transport for interschool sport, all classroom equipment, resources and stationery, some IT devices, programs and apps, Essential assessment tools, Compass and our updated Website.

Capital Building Fund:

In 2022 there will be a fee increase of \$50 to service the current loans plus saving for the planned future projects. We were unsuccessful in our 2021 submission for a capital grant to renovate the two-storey building. We are putting provisions in place to hope for a better outcome in our next submission to build flexible learning spaces with smaller class sizes to cater for students' different learning styles through the arts and science and improved collaboration, to build a movie theatre and a radio station to teach life skills.

The costs of running a school constantly increase and we want to provide the highest quality learning and teaching possible. We also believe in educating the 'whole child' that is spiritual, academic, social, emotional and physical. The increases to our School Fees are necessary to meet these challenges and continue to run a school which seeks excellence.

We have ensured our fees remain low compared with neighbouring Catholic schools.

As part of our mission as a Catholic school we hope that no student is disadvantaged because of the inability of parents to pay tuition fees therefore, we will be introducing a Concessional Fee Policy for all Health Care Card/CSEF recipients. From 2022, Parents who hold these cards are eligible to pay \$15 per week for school fees. Please make an appointment to speak with Rochelle or me if you wish to seek this discount.

As a matter of justice to all parents, we must mitigate the problem of unmet financial obligations for those who can afford to pay. The school community cannot carry the burden of unpaid Fees and Levies. MACS has endorsed the need, when necessary, for Debt Collection for any unpaid fees once students leave St Mary's.


If you have a payment plan set up, please ensure there are sufficient funds in you accounts. A dishonour fee of \$20 will be added to accounts should a payment bounce, as St Mary's cannot continue to bear these costs.

Annual Accounts for School Fees, Levies and Camp will be sent out in the first week of February 2022.

There are different options available for families to pay their School Fees and Levies. Please fill in the attached slip indicating your preferred payment option. It is an expectation that all families return this slip to the school office by Friday 3rd December of this school year.

The payment of fees is obligatory and part of acceptance by the school to educate your child. A copy of the 2022 Fee Schedule is included.

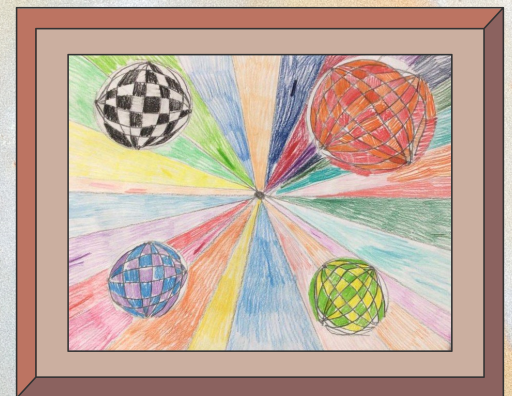

Dear families,

At St. Mary's, our focus is to create a culture which prioritises a safe, nurturing community for every child. There are seven minimum Child Safety Standards that all schools must implement. The Standards provide a framework for routinely reviewing and strengthening child safety strategies, policies and practices.

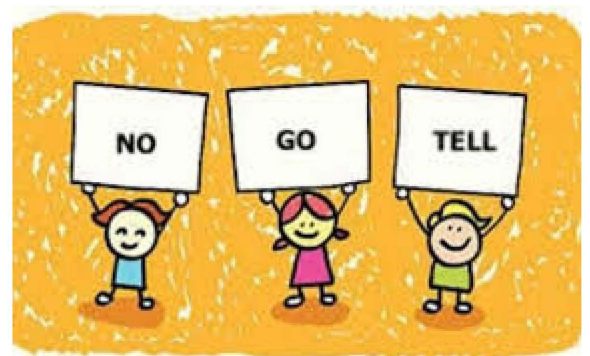
Standard Seven relates to EMPOWERMENT and PARTICIPATION.

At St. Mary's students participate in weekly Social and Emotional Learning sessions. We are a Rights, Resilience and Respectful Relationships school and refer to teaching resources on this topic. This term, as previously communicated, students in all year levels will be participating in lessons related to positive gender relations. These lessons aim to assist students to develop and practice assertiveness and help seeking strategies to protect themselves when they feel unsafe in situations.

One particular self-care and help-seeking strategy is the '**No, Go, Tell**' strategy. This strategy empowers children to assert their rights over their own bodies and to gain the support they need if someone is breaching their rights.

'NO, GO, TELL STRATEGY'

1. You have the right to say **NO** if someone is doing something to make you feel scared, unsafe or uncomfortable.
2. If the person won't stop, you can **GO** to a safer space, or try to find a way to keep yourself safe.
3. You can **TELL** someone about what has been happening. You can ask for help. If the first person you tell is not helpful, you can tell or ask someone else.



Everyone has the right to be respected. Other people have a responsibility to help you.

Talking about this strategy with your child(ren) will help to empower them and give them a strategy to use if they feel unsafe in a situation.
