Keeping Covid Safe

Thank you to our parent community for supporting our Covid safe plans. One element of our Covid Safe plan that we can improve in is ensuring all eligible students are wearing a mask indoors. I have received many lawful exemptions and thank you to those parents for sending them to me. If you have not sent me the reason for your child not wearing a mask then the regulations stipulate that all students from Years 3 to 6 wear a mask indoors and the CHO highly recommends that students from Prep to 2, also wear a mask. I spoke with the Dept of Health contact tracing unit and they are completely satisfied with our safety plans however we both agreed that the more we adhere to hand hygiene, physical distancing and mask wearing the better, so as to prevent positive cases of Covid19 in the school.

Working Together in Mission

The School Advisory Council (SAC) discussed the Working Together in Mission Charter for parishes and schools. The document emphasises the SAC's role in bringing the document to life. It talks about the importance of parent engagement in the life of the

school through the School Advisory Council and in the parish and school community. We will continue to present aspects of this document to the school community.

The Sacraments

Dates have been finalised for the Eucharist, Confirmation and Reconciliation sacramental celebrations which will all be held in November and December. Gabee and Ana have sent out the information and how to book for the sacraments. We pray for the children receiving the sacraments and for their families.

Staffing 2022

I continue to conduct interviews throughout this month as there will be some staff changes in 2022. Once I have completed staffing, I will inform everyone of the changes and the various year levels and leadership positions that teachers will be working in.

Visitors to St Mary's

Just a reminder, the use of Service Victoria QR codes for electronic record keeping is now mandatory in all schools to enable the effective contact tracing of any COVID-19 cases. At this stage, unfortunately, parents are still not permitted to enter the school premises. Essential visitors to our school admin building must comply with density limits, face mask requirements, QR code check-ins and practise respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene. Once volunteers are permitted to resume, they will be required to sign in and provide their vaccination status.

Graduation

We are so excited that we can provide a graduation for our Year 6 students. Similar to last year, due to restrictions we are unable to have parents attend at this stage. We understand how disappointed parents will feel. Should restrictions change once we hit Phase C 90% vaccinated, I will update and inform families immediately. We are currently looking into companies who can live stream the event.

Safety in the Carpark

It has come to my attention that unsafe practices are occurring at pick up and drop off times. It is imperative that when using the drop off zones, students' school bags still must not be in the boot because the student should promptly be exiting the car on the footpath side and parents/carers remain in the car. It is dangerous walking in between cars. Please remind and encourage your children to use the allocated supervised crossings. Secondly, the carpark is not a playground! Please ensure all students are standing with you, not rolling on the grass or playing chasey amongst the cars. Thank you for your support in this matter as child safety is paramount.

Covid Positive Update

On a positive note, once again, thus far all close contacts have tested negative. Our prayers and thoughts are with our students and their families, We look forward to welcoming you back soon. If your child is quarantining due to being a close contact outside of school please also inform me immediately so that we can provide appropriate learning support.

Positive Behaviours for Learning (PBL)







One of the important aspects of PBL is the explicit teaching of behaviour skills and expectations across the whole school. The behaviour skills help all students demonstrate and explain how they can be Respectful, Responsible and Resilient learners and friends.

One of the behaviour skills linked to 'I am resilient' is to...

See mistakes as learning opportunities.

Learning from mistakes and poor choices is such an important part of child development. Whether it involves school work, developing friendships, or playing a sport, learning is enriched through the mistakes we may make along the way.

Learning from mistakes is part of how we challenge ourselves to learn to do things differently. It motivates us to try new approaches through problem-solving. Learning from mistakes and failures isn't easy. All children need encouragement to learn and succeed. Positive words from family, friends and teachers during difficult learning challenges are essential for children's growth and development.

When a child makes a mistake in their learning or in a social situation a great skill for them to develop is the Stop, Think and Choose what to do approach.

<u>Stop</u> - don't let your mistake stop you from trying or having another go. Don't let your mistake cause you to have a bad day.

<u>Think</u> - What could I do differently next time? Who could I ask for help? Why did I make the mistake? How can I make things better?

<u>Choose what to do</u> - Make a decision with a growth mindset. Remind yourself that mistakes help us to learn. One mistake doesn't define who you are. If you make a mistake that hurts someone you can always make things right by apologising.

How you can help at home:

Practise the Stop, Think and Choose what to do approach when mistakes are made at home.

Acknowledge that you don't expect them to be perfect.

Let them know your love is unconditional, regardless of their mistakes or lapses in judgment.

Don't rescue kids from their mistakes. Instead, focus on the solution.

Provide examples of your own mistakes, the consequences, and how you learned from them.

Encourage children to take responsibility for their mistakes and not blame others.

Praise children for their efforts and courage to overcome setbacks.

Hurstbridge Line Duplication – upcoming works in Greensborough

The second stage of the Hurstbridge Line Duplication will deliver further improvements, including more train services, less crowding on peak trains and better connections to public transport in Melbourne's north east.

Works include building new modern stations at Greensborough and Montmorency, and duplicating the rail track between Greensborough and Montmorency and between Diamond Creek and Wattle Glen, to allow more trains to run more often.

As previously communicated, early works for the Hurstbridge Line Duplication Project are nearing completion across Greensborough, Montmorency, Diamond Creek, Wattle Glen and Hurstbridge.

Between **7pm Wednesday 1 December and 5am Thursday 2 December** we will be investigating ground conditions on Sherbourne Road west, near the Para Road roundabout. A section of the outbound lane of Sherbourne Road will be closed during that time, for your safety please observe road signage for detours.

Buses will replace trains on the Mernda and Hurstbridge lines between Parliament, Reservoir and Heidelberg from **9pm Thursday 9 December to last service Monday 13 December**. Plan your journey at **ptv.vic.gov.au** or call **1800 800 007**.

Works underway

Works ongoing throughout November include:

- continuation of combined service route (CSR) works, including the excavation and installation of underground power and signalling equipment
- ground investigations on Sherbourne Road west
- geotechnical investigations
- installation of fencing and placement of barriers on roads to create a safe work environment
- reinstatement of impacted areas.

What to expect

- Majority of works will take place during normal construction hours, between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday
- On the night of 1 December, works at night between 7pm and 5am
- During November, some works will take place outside of normal construction hours between 7am and 5pm on Saturdays
- Construction vehicles will use road reserves and public parks to access the rail corridor, including Greensborough Skate Park, Whatmough Park, and EJ Andrews Reserve. The community will still have access to these parks
- Traffic management will be in place to ensure the safety of road users and pedestrians during works


