### LENTEN THEME 2022 - COURAGE TO HOPE

With political turmoil at home and abroad, a climate that needs nurturing and our communities that have suffered fear, uncertainty, restrictions and profound loss and grief, we need the courage to hope more than ever and we look to our God to sustain us.

This is the time to find our courage, to turn in hope to our loving God. It is through challenges and hard times that we find the strength within and draw on our faith to persevere and look with confidence to the future. Without courage we dare not hope. Without faith and hope, life is empty. During this Lenten time of reflection and prayer, let us remember that our God is always present, to hold us, to love us, to lead us forward to the Kingdom.

#### WEEK 3 GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today is the third weekend of Lent and we pause to reflect.

In the Gospel today Jesus reminds us of the randomness of tragedies in life and therefore of the importance of living a good life according to his teachings. Jesus warned his followers not to wait to repent any wrongdoing because life may end without warning. Redemption and salvation await those who recognise the need to change their ways of living as they grow in faith. Like the fig tree Jesus wants us to 'bear fruit' in our lives. ### UPDATE FROM THE PARTNERED PARISHES PLENARY FACILITATORS' GROUP

Currently, as an action that we can take up locally, the Group is exploring ways of acknowledging the pain caused by sexual abuse perpetrated by Church personnel. There are three projects underway. One is a plaque to be placed in a prominent place outside each church, acknowledging the pain caused and expressing sorrow. Another is a ritual of lament, or something similar, for each of our parishes and the third is a letter to the Archbishop with a request for a sculpture and plaque to be installed in the Cathedral garden, facing Albert Street.

When our three parishes gathered for the Plenary Listening and Discussion - and Discernment sessions, one major focus for most groups that emerged, was the sexual abuse of children perpetrated by Church personnel. You may recall that we have two avenues of response proposed to us by the Plenary Council. One was to consider what God was asking the Church of Australia at a national level and the other was to consider what God is asking of us locally. We have been working together to respond as best we can as Partnered Parishes, addressing those local issues. So far relationships have been strengthened or developed with our local Catholic secondary schools, we have written to the Plenary Council in response to their document outlining the fruits of their discussions last year, we have established a Faith Circles Group, we have developed a PowerPoint welcoming all to our churches, from St Mary's - a response to the desire expressed for the parish to have a focus on mental ill health and we are liaising with our Liturgy Teams with your feedback. We hope that our parishes continue to be a sign of the Spirit active in the world, as we find ways to respond to the desires that you, our parishioners, have voiced during those Plenary times. *Any feedback from you is welcome.*

## WALK FOR WILAI

The Parishes of Sacred Heart and St Thomas the Apostle Combined Social Justice Group has in recent years provided donations to the Wilai Foundation as our international project. The Wilai Foundation sponsors orphaned children from Thailand and Myanmar, and assists with their upbringing and education, as well as raising awareness of statelessness. Their Founder, Fr Jim Carty sm, walked the Camino two years ago at the age of 80, in order to raise much needed funds.

This year the Foundation is running an 'Australian Camino', The Walk for Wilai. It travels from Portland, Vic to Penola, SA, leaving 31 March arriving 10 April. It would normally cost \$1,500 but the Foundation have offered us a place on the walk for free. This is a wonderful opportunity for someone with a good level of fitness, some available time, and an interest in world problems. 



#### Lectionary Art and Reflection by Jenny Close

There is a tough but fair Lenten message in the parable of the fig tree: before it is chopped down and reduced to dead wood, the tree is given one more chance to be fruitful. There is a 'be warned' side to this story and a 'take heart' aspect as well. Yes, be warned because every one of us has to be fruitful in our own way, and yes, take heart because God is on our side. What is the dead wood in your life and what needs nourishment?

## Third Sunday of Lent, Year C

#### First Reading Ex 3:1-8, 13-15

This is what you must say to the children of Israel: I Am has sent me to you.

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his father-in-law, priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked; there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up. 'I must go and look at this strange sight,' Moses said, 'and see why the bush is not burnt.' Now the Lord saw him go forward to look, and God called to him from the middle of the bush. 'Moses, Moses!' he said. 'Here I am' he answered. 'Come no nearer' he said. 'Take off your shoes, for the place on which you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your father,' he said 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.' At this Moses covered his face, afraid to look at God.

And the Lord said, 'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes, I am well aware of their sufferings. I mean to deliver them out of the hands of the Egyptians and bring them up out of that land to a land rich and broad, a land where milk and honey flow.'

Then Moses said to God, 'I am to go, then, to the sons of Israel and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you." But if they ask me what his name is, what am I to tell them?' And God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am. This' he added 'is what you must say to the sons of Israel: "The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you." This is my name for all time; by this name I shall be invoked for all generations to come.'

### Second Reading 1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12

All this that happened to the people of Moses in the desert was written for our benefit.

I want to remind you how our fathers were all guided by a cloud above them and how they all passed through the sea. They were all baptised into Moses in this cloud and in this sea; all ate the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, since they all drank from the spiritual rock that followed them as they went, and that rock was Christ. In spite of this, most of them failed to please God and their corpses littered the desert.

These things all happened as warnings for us, not to have the wicked lusts for forbidden things that they had. You must never complain: some of them did, and they were killed by the Destroyer.

All this happened to them as a warning and it was written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age. The man who thinks he is safe must be careful that he does not fall.

### Gospel Acclamation Mt 4:17

Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

Repent, says the Lord; the kingdom of heaven is at hand. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

### Gospel Lk 13:1-9

Unless you repent you will all perish as they did.

Some people arrived and told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with that of their sacrifices. At this he said to them, 'Do you suppose these Galileans who suffered like that were greater sinners than any other Galileans? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen on whom the tower at Siloam fell and killed them? Do you suppose that they were more guilty than all the other people living in Jerusalem? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did.

He told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came looking for fruit on it but found none. He said to the man who looked after the vineyard, "Look here, for three years now I have been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and finding none. Cut it down: why should it be taking up the ground?" "Sir," the man replied "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can cut it down."'

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Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

There was a terrible disaster when a building fell down killing eighteen people. Some said, 'Oh, those killed must have been sinners, they or their parents.' Jesus repudiates that notion: 'No, it wasn't for anything *they* did.' It was clear to Jesus that they were the victims of poor construction and conditions at Siloam. Look at the builder.

Responsibility needs to be brought home to those who would otherwise hide behind a religious ideology, or the sheer self-interest of evading blame for a situation.

To identify those really responsible may well require major changes to the way society is organised.

Does it all seem too difficult? Jesus helps us with a metaphor:

You are like a fig tree which may not be bearing much fruit just now,

but, I am a terrific gardener:

I will water you, dig around you, make sure you are well nourished

so that you will bear the fruits I desire.

Our Lord does that by:

watering us with the waters of baptism;

pruning us, especially during Lent;

nourishing us with the bread of life in Holy Communion.

We might pause at various times during Lent to allow Our Lord to garden us so that he may create a heavenly botanical garden, a new Eden, of the whole of humanity.
