UPDATE ON THE PROPOSED ADDITIONAL TABERNACLE

Dear parishioners,

This week in the newsletter we have provided a visual depiction of the *possible addition* of a Tabernacle in the body of the Church. This temporary measures have been implemented until the 1st of October. An existing extra tabernacle has been placed in the Seasonal Chapel. A makeshift temporary "wall" has been erected to block off the Adoration Chapel from the body of the Church, thus retaining the ability to pray after hours in the Adoration Chapel or to collect hosts for the sick. Following a PPC meeting held on Wednesday night a proposal was put forth which will go to the working committee that we have 2 tabernacles in the church, but the Sacred Host of the Eucharist is only kept in the Adoration Chapel.

When a Mass or other liturgies are celebrated, the Eucharist is moved into the Church before Mass and returned to the Adoration chapel after Mass concludes.

Under Church law 'Cannon Law" we are not permitted to have 2 active tabernacles under the same roof.

This proposal would firstly, allow the parishioners who long for the presence of the Eucharist in a tabernacle in the body of the Church during a Mass to be fulfilled. Secondly the need for any structural alterations to the Church would be obsolete as the Eucharist is securely kept in the Adoration chapel at other times.

If we are excluded it is because we have not understood or lived the kingdom values which give preferential option to the poor and the marginalised.

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

21 August 2022

First Reading Is 66:18-21

They will gather all of your people from all nations.

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal, and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory to the nations. As an offering to the Lord they will bring all your brothers, on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules, on dromedaries, from all the nations to my holy mountain in Jerusalem, says the Lord, like Israelites bringing oblations in clean vessels to the Temple of the Lord. And of some of them I will make priests and Levites, says the Lord.

Second Reading Heb 12:5-7, 11-13

The Lord disciplines those he loves.

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son. when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

Gospel Acclamation Jn 14:6

I am the way, the truth, and the life, says the Lord;
no one comes to the Father, except through me.

Gospel Lk 13:22-30

Alleluia!

From East and West they will come to take their place in the kingdom of God.

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed.

'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!"

'Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.

'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'

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Reflection by Greg Sunter

This week's gospel passage picks up one of the major themes that runs throughout the gospel of Luke: the message of salvation is not reserved exclusively for the Jews, but is for all people; Jew and Gentile alike. A number of times in this gospel, the writer makes a point of having Jesus relate this controversial and fairly unpopular message to his audience. Today's gospel makes clear that to gain salvation, you have to do more than just show up! Like those knocking on the locked door and claiming friendship, we can't just turn up at the last minute and expect to be received. Salvation - entrance into the kingdom of God - belongs to those who accept the message of Jesus and act on it for the rest of their lives.

The gospel makes plain to the Jewish people of the time that unless they accept the message of Jesus and act upon it, they will get a terrible shock ('weeping and grinding of teeth') at the coming of the kingdom. Those who believe in name only will find themselves looking in from the outside and will see the greatest prophets in the kingdom while they themselves are denied access. To further make the point, they are told that people from east and west, north and south will be welcomed into the feast of the kingdom. References to people from the four points of the compass always indicate people from other lands - non-Jews. Jesus tells his audience that people who are faithful to his message, even though they may be Gentile, will gain salvation before anyone who thinks they deserve it because of their birth or title. The kingdom must be earned through faithful effort, not by just turning up and claiming to be a believer.
