Parent/Teacher/Child Conversations



camp rumbug

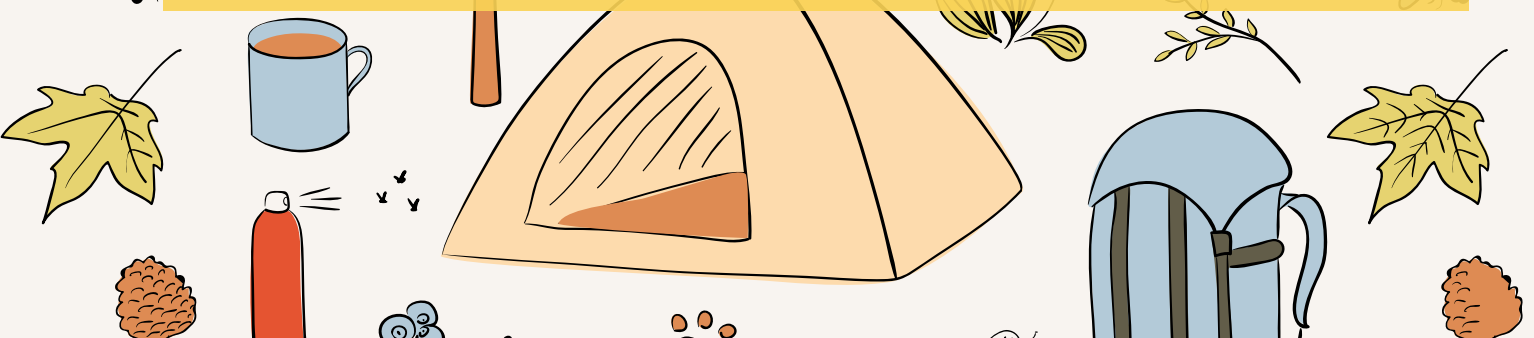

This means that we have an opportunity to vote as Shadow judges, for the books shortlisted to receive the 2023 CBCA 'Read, Grow Inspire' awards. We have students reading and looking at specific elements of the Shortlisted books, to analyze and identify ways that authors present information and convey messages. The students involved in this group are thoroughly enjoying meeting in the Library/Anderson Discovery Centre weekly. We are currently looking at the range of elements that authors draw upon, in order to convey information and grab the reader's attention.

Love and Mental Peace

This Parish group was set up to inform members of our community about Mental Health. We also aim to help support those members of our Parish who suffer with depression, anxiety and/or post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), as well as those who care for them.

There is often confusion and misunderstanding about the reality of mental illness. With this in mind, we are offering an information evening to listen to a very inspirational speaker share her journey with mental illness.

Lauren McDonough is a 25 year old woman from Melbourne. She is a mental health advocate, suicide survivor and now a model.

She has lived with depression and PTSD since she was 14 years old. She has a strong lived experience with a mental health condition, which has given her the drive and determination to reduce the stigma of mental health, based on her lived experience.

She now shares her remarkable story of resilience, in the hope that it will help others by reducing the stigma towards mental health conditions, to provide hope to others and to encourage healthier and more frequent conversations around mental health conditions.
