Alignment of Behaviour and Academics

The leadership executive and coaches had the privilege of listening to Prof Tom Bennett, author of 'Running the Room' speak recently. This professional learning comes at a very important time in education as we are seeing many student behaviours which are totally unacceptable in a school environment and they will not be tolerated. We need your support as parents and as partners in the learning to work with us to ensure all children are showing up each day being the best they can be.

The three priorities are 1. safety 2. predictable, calm, classrooms and 3. dignity for all (including the teachers).



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Uniform

Earlier in the year I noticed some students were wearing bike shorts instead of the St Mary's shorts. Once again it seems to have crept back in. Please be aware that parents will be called to supply the correct uniform should a student wear them to school as we take great pride in our St Mary's uniform and want our students to do the same.

Make-Up at School

As our students are primary aged we want them to enjoy their childhood and the freedom that is associated with that. I have noticed that some Year 6 students are wearing makeup to school which creates a divide between students. St Mary's policy states clearly that make-up is not to be worn at school. 

First Aid Learning for our Juniors



Important changes to pedestrian paths in the

The pedestrian path on the southern side of Grimshaw Street, between Greensborough Road and Greensborough Highway, will be closed from late May.

In late June, the closure will be extended to between Peters Street and Greensborough Road and remain in place until 2028.

This year we'll prepare the area ahead of major construction to build the new Grimshaw Street interchange as part of the M80 Ring Road Completion.

Grimshaw Street pedestrian detour

The pedestrian path on the northern side of Grimshaw Street will remain open as the signed detour route with safe crossing points at the signalised intersections at Watsonia and Greensborough roads.

From mid-June, another safe crossing point will be added at Frye Street as part of a temporary signalised intersection now under construction.


