# **ENRICHMENT NEWS**

Our St Mary's Fire Carriers and CBCA (Children's Book Council Awards) Shadow Judges were invited to see a NAIDOC presentation hosted by the National Portrait Gallery Canberra. We participated via zoom and saw portraits of famous Aboriginal people including Cathy Freeman and Adam Goodes. We were asked to respond to the style of artwork and draw comparisons between the paintings and our perceptions of these people.

We were asked to explain the role of our Fire carriers here at school. I posed the question to some of our six Fire Carriers and they said "Our role is to take care of and respect Aboriginal heritage. It's to help people realise and appreciate how much Aboriginal people cared for and respected the lands on which we live. We try to teach everyone else about this'. The opportunity to focus on the accomplishments of famous Aboriginal people supported us in our Shadow Judging tasks.Three of the six books shortlisted allow us to learn more about Aboriginal culture and heritage.
