Grandparents & Special Friends' Day

Our Grandparents and Special Friends' day was a wonderful celebration of our family community and a chance for the children to show the special people in their lives some of the things that occur within a school day. Having Fr Ananda celebrate Mass with our community was a special way to commence our day. The children then enjoyed completing activities with their grandparents and special friends and our morning was completed with a delicious morning tea supplied by our families and run by our Parents Association. It is through special days like this, that we truly realise how lucky we are to be a part of such a dynamic community. Thank you to all of our wonderful staff for their preparation and enthusiasm for the day.

NE Community Fund

Throughout 2023 and 2024 our community has been raising funds for a full upgrade to the external Basketball Court. We have received two quotes, one for \$69K and the other for \$116K. Last year we engaged three companies but only received two quotes. As is standard for such a large project, three quotes are required. Last term I engaged a third company who has not yet provided their quote. It is quite a complex project as we have industrial stormwater drainage in that area so it is reasonable to expect the quotes to include major earthworks

and landscaping. To expedite the project I am applying for a grant through the NE Community Fund. I hope to be successful so that we can provide a beautiful safe play area for our students and the community. Thank you to all the families who continue to support this project.

Uniform Shop News

As you have been aware, it has been considerably difficult organising volunteers for our uniform shop. Due to the cost of living and the need for so many parents to be working, and finding a time to assist or to purchase at the uniform shop has been difficult. Your feedback suggested that we find a better solution to our current situation. The SAC and I pursued the idea of moving our uniform shop to Spartan School World store (our main supplier) 97 Main Road, Lower Plenty. By doing so this will provide;

- a slight discount on many items for example, our school bag and winter rain jacket are both discounted \$3 in-store. The retailer agrees to hold the retail prices of each item for a period of 12 months.
- a commission paid to the school of 5% of all sales of school logo and school specific items
- delivery of items directly to your home or to school for collection each week or click and collect.
- A continuation of sale of the second hand items through our school
- Access to fittings 5 days per week and on some Saturdays
- 24/7 online ordering

We are commencing the process of moving our stock from Week 8 of this term. We are hoping the first retail day at the new venue will be week 1 of the September school holidays. Further information will be supplied when we move closer to the date. Currently sales at school will continue as per normal. I extend my deep appreciation of Nadine Alderuccio who over the past 5 years has volunteered as the coordinator of the uniform shop. She has worked so diligently and seamlessly ensuring supply for families. Her work has been immense and I am so grateful for her support. Nadine also agrees that this course of action is the best way forward for St Mary's uniform shop.

Student Safety Around Cars Kiss and Drop Area

Over the past few weeks I have noticed that some parents are encouraging and allowing their child/ren to enter their car along the driveway before they are stationary at the Kiss and Drop. This course of action is causing cars to bank up on Grimshaw St and is dangerous as there is no-one supervising. I ask parents to be patient and wait until your car is at the 'Kiss and Drop' before collecting your child. Please remind your child that they are to wait at the Admin Building Kiss and Drop Zone.

Please remind your children to walk along the footpath (not on the roadway) when walking to the Williams St pick up. Under no circumstances are students in this area allowed to enter the car on the passenger side. For safety, they must enter on the driver's side of the car.

I have the delegated power to grant an exemption from the requirement of attendance at a school where the exemption will apply for less than one school year. MACS guidelines state that Parents/guardians/carers should be encouraged to plan holidays for students during gazetted school holiday periods and pupil free days. 

- Do not line up before 3:15pm as you will block traffic flow.

**If your child is not at your designated pick-up area, you must exit the line and loop back around. Blocking traffic is not an option.







Greensborough Station Car Park and bus interchange

Night works - August to September 2024

The Victorian Government's Car Parks for Commuters Program is working in partnership with the Australian Government to deliver more station car parking at Greensborough Station. The Victorian Government is also building a new bus interchange. This will free up local streets and make it easier to catch the train.

Works are continuing on the new multi-deck car park and bus interchange. In the coming weeks, works will be completed to upgrade the Para Road and Flintoff Street intersection and signalised pedestrian crossing.

The project is expected to be completed by late 2024.

What's happening

We will work **24** hours a day between **Tuesday 20** August until Monday **30** September. To facilitate these works each night between **8pm and 6am** we'll close Flintoff Street and a section of Para Road. Impacted households will be notified directly.

You may notice increased construction noise and activity with vehicles and workers moving around the area. For the safety of the community and our workforce, please take the time to follow detour signage and traffic management in the area.


