### **Expressions of interest**

Generally, expressions of interest in becoming a council member are made in advance of the set annual appointment round devised by the council. The process of applying for membership of the St Mary's Primary School – School Advisory Council is publicized to the community, through the school newsletter. Anyone interested in becoming a member of the St Mary's Primary School – School Advisory Council may seek advice from the principal, chair or parish priest on the process of appointment. Consideration will also be given to succession planning through staggered renewal of members to ensure continuing institutional memory. The following is a list of some of the key qualities and skills for members of the School Advisory Council:

- commitment to the MACS Statement of Mission
- commitment to Catholic education in the parish and school
- commitment to the vision and mission of the parish and school
- understanding of the role of parish priest as the custodian of mission, principal as the leader of the school and council members
- willingness to ask questions and seek clarification
- ability to think strategically
- willingness to support the contributions of other council members
- capacity to listen in an active and meaningful way
- willingness to work cooperatively with others
- commitment to always maintaining confidentiality.

The St Mary's Primary School - School Advisory Council meets at least once a month in the school terms with a maximum of six-eight meetings during the year.

### Reporting to parents

Just a reminder that learning is a partnership between the school, the students and parents. St Mary's Leadership Team has assessed the opportunities available to share your child's progress with you. We believe it is important that you know how your child is tracking so that we can work together to ensure your child's progress. Therefore, in Term 1 on the 24th March we will be holding Parent/Teacher/Child Conversations. This will provide an opportunity for you to share vital information about your child and the teacher will have an opportunity to share your child's results from the assessment days, with you and your child. This will be a school closure day instead of the July P/T/C conversation date previously advertised. Reports will be shared in Term 2. In Term 3 on September 9th the second Parent/Teacher/Child Meeting will take place. The reports will be shared in Term 4.

### Infrastructure Update

**Basketball Court** 

The Basketball Court rebuild has been ratified by the ABFC. MACS requested a geotech report and in the last few weeks we have ensured extensive underground investigation to establish exactly where the stormwater pipes and pits are located. The outcome restricts us from landscaping towards the classrooms however we can extend the length of the court. The next step is meeting with Grassports to identify exactly where the obstacles are located and to receive a revised drawing of the court with the geotech information we have acquired.

### Adherence to St Mary's Uniform

Please support the school as we tackle the issue of incorrect **school uniform**. St Mary's has a beautiful uniform and we expect our students to wear the correct uniform. By doing so, we stop competition and students influencing others to look a certain way. It also ensures that parents do not need to purchase clothing, jewellery nor make-up for their child to wear to school.
