#### **WhatsApp Rules and Purpose**

In 2021 I introduced the Class Liaison program to encourage inclusion of all members of our community to ensure an inclusive community. # WhatsApp Core Principles: Archdiocese

- **Respect:** Treat all members with kindness and respect, avoid personal attacks, shaming, or bullying. Assume positive intent in other members' actions.
- **On-Topic:** Keep posts and comments relevant to the group's purpose of event sharing, birth notification or death of family members notification or classroom whole school volunteering and events.
- No Spam or Unsolicited Promotions: Refrain from self-promotion, spam, or irrelevant links.
- **Privacy:** Respect everyone's privacy and avoid sharing sensitive information outside the group without permission.
