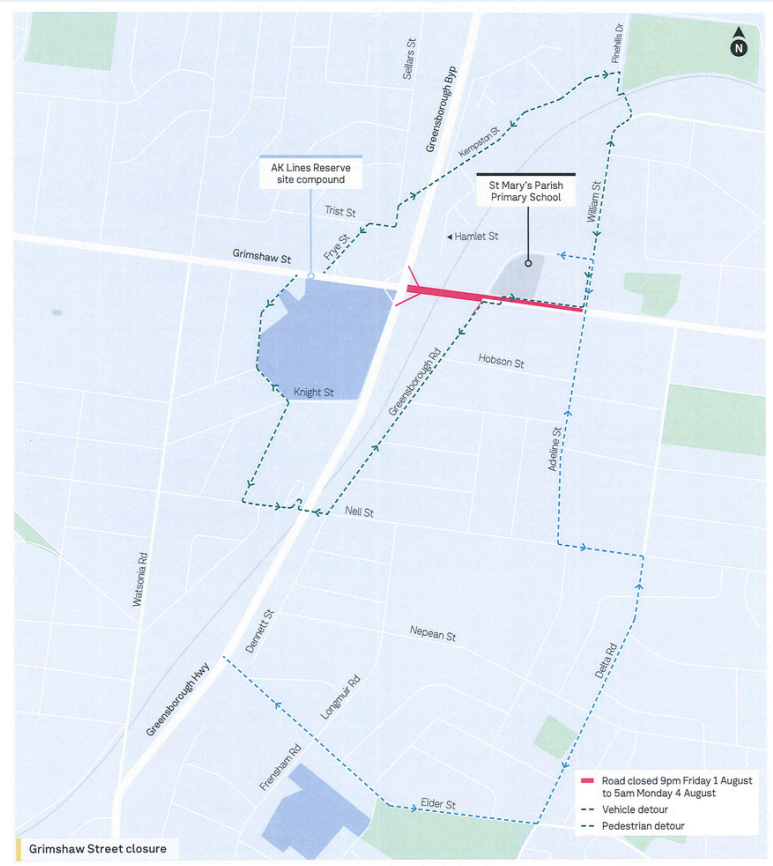
Prep 2026 Interviews

Closure to Grimshaw St Updates

Infrastructure Update

Presently we are in the tender process for the refurbishment of the two storey building. Approximately forty-five companies showed an expression of interest in our refurbishment. Of those forty-five building companies, six companies have been shortlisted. They all completed a reconnaissance of the build last week. We are awaiting the permission to decant the building in readiness for the program to begin.

Traffic Safety

Once again, I have noticed of late that some parents are coaxing their children to get in the car prior to the *kiss and drop* area. Be patient! This is a dangerous activity as there is no staff supervision and then the drivers are becoming frustrated that it is taking so long to exit the car park. Please remember, when supervising the entrance into cars we notice who the children are leaving with and that they are safe because they are leaving in the designated area. Please remind your child/ren they are to wait at the front of the school admin area if being picked up at the '*Kiss and Drop*'. Please get into the habit of collecting your child at the '*Kiss and Drop*'

Front of Admin Drop-Off Procedures

Just a reminder that all students must exit their vehicles on the left hand side of the car at the Admin drop off area. This is a safety issue due to cars occasionally overtaking at that time and thus compromising the safety of our students.

Meditation time

Parents/Carers, please remember to be still and silent during meditation time. We encourage you to stay for meditation as we know of the benefits for everyone. If you must leave, we ask that parents/carers refrain from speaking and walking through the admin building as our students are silently meditating with me and the Admin team. This will support all involved to focus on meditation and be less distracted. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Child Safety

Signing in is required of all visitors and volunteers at school. This process is essential and ensures the safety of all students and visitors to St Mary's. We must know who is present at St Mary's at all times. Please remember to carry your VIT or Working with Children's Check cards with you when volunteering at the school as the Admin Team may request updated paperwork upon signing in.

Vandalism of Toilets

Please speak with your child/ren about the importance of respecting school property (all property). It pains me to inform you that some or one of our students are costing the school money (your money) due to vandalising our toilets. Every time we need to call on a plumber it is costly and causes disruption. The shelter shed toilets in the have been vandalised and needed to be closed for repairs due to the vandalism. Michael, our maintenance man spent hours repairing the damage and now they are damaged again. This disrespect for property is certainly not what we would expect of a St Mary's student. I ask you to support us in helping our students understand how we care for proper use of facilities.

School Attendance : Everyday Counts

Dear Parents and Carers,

In 2025 St Mary's has had 323 students taking extended holiday leave (three or more days absence) away from school learning time. In all my years as an educator I have never seen so many children missing vital school time. I understand that a vacation in school holiday time is extremely expensive, however the loss of learning is really impacting your child's achievements both academically and socially. I understand severe illness and I also understand that for some children engaging in school life can be a difficult journey for a variety of reasons.

Before considering taking your child out of school or allowing them to have a day off please understand the ramifications for learning. Naturally illness is a legitimate reason to be absent.

Even missing one day can impact knowledge attainment. I was recently observing in a classroom. A child requested to go to the toilet. In the time that the student was absent, the teacher taught a new aspect of the river system. By the time the student returned to class she had already missed a whole chunk of learning necessary to build on the next block of learning. Fortunately that particular teacher was able to support that child to catch up on their learning. When you multiply in-attendance, the loss of learning is compounded and nigh impossible to catch up on every aspect taught.

A student absence learning plan goes some way to addressing the issue however it can never replace what a student learns throughout the day.

At St Mary's we teach using a coherent knowledge rich curriculum which means that one piece of knowledge supports the understanding of the next piece and builds a strong schema for the brain to attain and store that knowledge in the long term memory.

The Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) Vision for Engagement highlights the importance of daily attendance. Student engagement encompasses attendance, behaviour, belonging, learning, mental health and wellbeing, and motivation.

MACS recognises that improving engagement involves knowing our students academically, socially and emotionally so that teachers can attend to the needs of each student across the breadth of school life.

For students at MACS schools, engagement includes:

- attending school every day, on time
- feeling safe and connected at school
- receiving instruction that is targeted to need, and supports growth and achievement
- adopting classroom routines that ensure everyone understands expectations
- receiving a coordinated and effective system of increasingly intensive tiered interventions and supports across all areas of their learning
- feeling they belong in the school environment
- listening intently and paying attention
- persisting with complex tasks and being motivated to learn
- behaving respectfully towards others
- being supported with mental health and wellbeing
- being part of stronger partnerships between the school and family
- experiencing caring relationships with teachers and school staff.

Thank you for taking the time to read this important message. I cannot emphasize enough the importance of punctual attendance. Please read the linked everyday counts document.
